RISING FROM THE RAILS: THE STORY OF THE PULLMAN PORTER Honors African-American Trailblazers

Known as Pullman Porters, they were brought aboard to serve the wealthy white passengers during the "Golden Age of Railroad Travel," but as the documentary shows, they were so much more than paid attendants. Traveling across the country, they served as social ambassadors, carrying labor organization skills, elements of black culture such as jazz and blues, and civil rights ideals throughout the United States. The Pullman Porters built the foundations of a new black social class and inspired future leaders, including their own descendants, to develop independent businesses.

Highlights of the documentary include interviews with a former porter who served for 22 years and the family members of porters now deceased. Larry Tye, the author of the best-selling book upon which the film is based, and Dr. Juliet Walker, an expert in black economic history at the University of Texas, offer their insights as well.

THE ART DETECTIVES Take on the Case of Restoring Britain's Hidden Artworks

Within the British national archive there sit at least 40,000 paintings not attributed to any particular artist. Distributed by American Public Television and releasing on public television stations nationwide beginning January 1, 2018, **THE ART DETECTIVES** follows noted art dealer and historian Dr. Bendor Grosvenor (*Fake or Fortune?*) as he tracks down these lost and hidden treasures. With the help of fellow art historian Jacky Klein, he learns the history of each piece and restores the work for public display.

In this three-part series, Klein and Grosvenor travel to museums across the British Isles, discovering works with fascinating histories attached. At Swansea museum in Wales, they uncover a valuable painting that will not only become a star of the collection but also change the course of art history. In Aberdeenshire, Scotland, the Haddo House may hold clues to the nation's greatest lost treasure, while the nearby Montrose Museum holds a painting in desperate need of restoration. Concluding in Belfast, the team investigates a series of works that have long been considered cheap imitations of Breughel the Younger but may actually have enormous value.
